#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

Over the weekend, legislators left Juneau to hold constituent meetings.

Governor Walker ordered state flags to be flown at half-staff beginning Tuesday, February 27<sup>th</sup> in honor of former House Speaker Joe Hayes who passed away February 16, 2018 at the age of 88.

Speaker Hayes served in the Alaska State House from 1977 to 1984 and as Speaker of the House from 1981 to 1984.

The Department of Revenue released marijuana tax revenue collection numbers for the month of January and for the first time since recreational marijuana was legalized the revenue topped \$1 million for one month.

The Senate passed <u>SCR 5</u> proclaiming March 2, 2019, Alaska Reads Day Similar resolutions have passed in California, Indiana and on the federal level designating March 2 as Read Day, coinciding with Dr. Seuss' birthday, a day to create awareness of literacy.

<u>SCR 17</u>, declaring April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month, passed the Senate on March 1<sup>st</sup>. The resolution brings attention to the problem of sexual violence and recognizes Alaska's volunteers, staff and agencies working to end sexual assault; in 2016 over 3,100 volunteers devoted 48,483 hours of service in Alaska.

The House passed <u>HB 307</u>, legislation to update Alaska's Code of Military Justice to mirror recent updates to the Federal Uniform Code of Military Justice.

## **BUDGET ISSUES**

House Finance wrapped up public testimony on the operating and mental health budgets on Saturday.

The Committee will hold hearings each morning and afternoon throughout next week to take up amendments.

They plan on adopting new committee substitutes on Friday, which could set up Floor votes the week of March 12<sup>th</sup>.

#### What else is happening?

HCR 19, Governor: AK Native Languages Emergency, sponsored by Rep. Ortiz is being heard in HCRA at 8am on **Tuesday**. The resolution calls on the Governor to work with the legislature, the Alaska Native Language Preservation and Advisory Council, and Alaska Native organizations to ensure the survival and continued use of all 20 of the state's Alaska Native languages.

The resolution also urges the Governor to issue an administrative order recognizing a linguistic emergency.

HB 310, Marriage and Minimum Age for Marriage will be heard in HSTA at 3:15pm on **Tuesday**.

**Wednesday** starts with an 8:00am HEDC hearing regarding the Increase Base Student Allocation (<u>HB 339</u>) and continues with <u>SB 124</u> Abortion Procedures, Child Surrender in SJUD on at 1:30pm; after confirmation hearings, SHSS will hear Christy Lawton OCS, Director, responding to the OCS Citizen Review Panel report; and if there is time after confirmation hearings in HL&C, they'll be hearing <u>HB 326</u>, Naturopaths; Licensing; Practice.

**Thursday,** HSTA will take up Discrimination: Gender Identity; Sexual Orientation (<u>HB 184</u>) at 3:15pm and at 3:30pm, <u>SB 186</u>, Voter Registration & PFD App Registration will be heard in SSTA

The week ends with another hearing for <u>SB 124</u> Abortion Procedures, Child Surrender in SJUD at 1:30pm.
